Changes to Virgin Australia's policy for carriage of lithium **batteries**

As of 1 December 2025, Virgin Australia has changed its policy for carriage of lithium batteries. The new policy includes common items like power banks, spare batteries and portable electronic devices. These changes are designed with safety as the first priority and to comply with aviation regulations. Items

your customers have previously included in checked baggage may need to be packed differently. When Guests travel on Virgin Australia flights they must: • Keep battery-powered items close onboard - power banks, spare batteries and small portable electronic devices must be stowed in the seat pocket, under the

seat in front, or be held in the Guest's hands; • Not use power banks on board the aircraft to charge another device;

- Not charge power banks on board the aircraft;
- electronic devices; and • Observe limits on the capacity of the batteries and power banks.

• Observe limits on the quantity of spare batteries, power banks, portable

bank is found in checked baggage, it must be removed. The item may need to be removed by the Guest (in Australia), or it may be removed by a regulatory body or security service without notice (in New Zealand and Indonesia).

There is no change to the requirements for checked baggage: batteries and power banks must never be placed in checked baggage. If a battery or power
